

# **Rogation Sunday**

### **Beating the Bounds**

Rogation means an asking of God - for blessing on the seed and land for the year ahead. It is appropriate in any emergency, war, plague, drought or foul weather.

The practice began with the Romans, who invoked the help of the gods Terminus and Ambarvalia. In those days a crowd moved in procession around the cornfields, singing and dancing, sacrificing animals, and driving away Winter with sticks. They wanted to rid the cornfields of evil.

In about 465 the Western world was suffering from earthquake, storm and epidemic. So Mamertius, Bishop of Vienne, aware of the popular pagan custom, ordered that prayers should be said in the ruined or neglected fields on the days leading up to Ascension. With his decision, 'beating the bounds' became a Christian ceremonial.

Rogation-tide arrived in England early in the eighth century and became a fixed and perennial asking for help of the Christian God.

On Rogation-tide, a little party would set out to trace the boundaries of the parish. At the head marched the bishop or the priest, with a minor official bearing a Cross, and after them the people of the parish, with schoolboys and their master trailing along. Most of them held slender wands of willow.

At certain points along the route - at well-known landmarks like a bridge or stile or ancient tree, the Cross halted, the party gathered about the priest, and a litany or rogation is said, imploring God to send seasonable wealth, keep the corn and roots and boughs in good health, and bring them to an ample harvest. At some point beer and cheese would be waiting.

In the days when maps were neither common nor accurate, there was much to be said for 'beating the bounds.' It was still very common as late as the reign of Queen Victoria. Certainly, parish boundaries rarely came into dispute, for everyone knew them. Do you know ours?

# **Bible Readings**

#### Acts 17:22-31

**22** Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: 'People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. **23** For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: to an unknown god. So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship – and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.

24 'The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. 25 And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else. 26 From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. 27 God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us.

28 "For in him we live and move and have our being." [a] As some of your own poets have said, "We are his offspring." [b]

29 'Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone – an image made by human design and skill. 30 In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. 31 For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead.'

# **Reflection - by Margaret**

This week's gospel follows on closely from last week. Jesus is reiterating to the disciples that he is going to the Father, he's returning to God's kingdom.

The disciples have to be told things several times. They had Jesus with them alongside them but still they got confused, so it's not surprising that we get confused about what Jesus is saying and what it means for us today.

Jesus is warning the disciples that he will be returning to his Father,

#### BUT

He is leaving a helper behind to help with their faith and enabling them to continue his ministry. This helper will be with them at all times and then be with fellow Christians to the end of time. This helper will be an advocate between Christians and God and between Christians and non believers.

The Spirit of Jesus will be a helper, an advocate, and a comforter.

- A helper to assist us, to give us the strength to minister to others.
- An advocate to plead our case, to stand with Christians when they face persecution for their Faith.
- A comforter in these times of crisis we need to feel that comfort which comes from knowing we are part of God's family. A comforter who will put his arms around us and give us a hug, at the moment we can't hug others even though they may be in great distress, this in itself causes us distress.

A hug, a kind word can mean so much, so just hold on to those kind words with the reassurance that the hugs will come later. I know I have lots of hugs to give out when all this lockdown is over.

### BUT

When we call to God, when we sit in silence and wait we can and will hear his voice of reassurance and feel his presence with us.

Whatever we ask for we need to ask in Jesus name, not just saying those words but getting to know who Jesus is, being drawn into his life, his love, his sense of purpose.

Anything is possible through the Father, Son and Holy Spirit just have Faith and Believe.

The last three verses give us some promises.

We will see Jesus face to face, we will live his new life.

We will know that Jesus and the father are one and through our Faith we are one with them.

We as Christians are called to be part of that circle. We can work through our Faith so that others would come to know the love of God.

At this time of crisis more people are turning to God, to hear services of the word and to pray to him.


Our hope is that they find him and have their Faith confirmed, renewed and restored. That God can live in them as he lives in us.

This is a true story and made it into the local press at the time...


