## Sunday Worship from 18th April 2021

Both our Church buildings will once again open for public worship this coming Sunday.

Holy Trinity and St Oswald's, Finningley at 10.00am.

St Saviour's, Auckley at 11.00am.

We know that some of you haven't been in either building for over a year, and perhaps you would now like to take the opportunity to worship physically in the church building, rather than over Zoom.

We know many of you have kindly held back and stuck to Zoom, but we can accommodate everyone who wants to come along. It could be that instead of weekly we attend physically every other week or once a month and zoom on the other Sundays.

### What Do I Need To Do?

If you would like to attend either church physically, then you will need to let us know as we need to maintain social distancing and so have limited places. Please contact the parish office on 01302 770240, email <u>parishoffice@fabparish.org.uk</u> to let us know, and we will confirm your seat by Friday evening. Previously a pattern worked out, so it became relatively straight forward.

### **How Will It Work?**

There is significant legislation and guidance still in place covering public worship. Both PCC's want to emphasise the need to follow them. If we cannot do so, then we will have to review the situation

### PLEASE NOTE: BEING VACCINATED DOES NOT REMOVE THE NEED TO SOCIALLY DISTANCE!

- The service at Finningley will be hybrid. It will be live streamed from the church building via Zoom as well as having people physically present.
- The service at Auckley will be on site only.
- Booking is essential as we are still required to continue with the 2m social distancing rules
  inside our buildings between different households/support bubbles.
- Face masks continue to be mandatory, unless someone is exempt.
- Inside there can be no 'mingling' at all between different households/support bubbles. Whilst we know fellowship and socialising is important to us all, we are not yet legally allowed to do so indoors. Mingling happens even if we talk 2m away from one another. This means that sadly we must just enter the building, sit down, worship, and at the end leave, with no talking to anyone outside our household/support bubble. Once outside the rule of 6 will apply.
- We must sanitise our hands on entering the building, before and after receiving communion, and finally before leaving the building.
- Singing indoors is sadly still not allowed.

## Will Everything Return to Normal on the 21st June?

That is a good question. I know we all long to be able to mix together again and of course sing, however, there are no guarantees, as yet, that things will simply revert to how they used to be on the 21st of June. Below is the current information we have, direct from the Government website.

### **Social Distancing and Face Masks**

"At Step 3: Finally, before Step 4 begins [21st June at the earliest], the government will complete a review of social distancing and other long-term measures that have been put in place to cut transmission. This will inform decisions on the timing and circumstances under which the rules on 1 metre plus, the wearing of face coverings and other measures may be lifted. This will also inform guidance on working from home – which should continue wherever possible until this review is complete.

By Step 4 which will take place no earlier than 21 June, the government hopes to be in a position to remove all legal limits on social contact."

It therefore reads that a review unsocial distancing and masks will take place between Step 3 [17th May at the earliest] and Step 4, and that this will then be used to inform future decisions.

In addition they add the following, which mentions Wedding and other life events:

### "Business, activities and life events (Weddings, Baptisms, Funerals)

We hope to reopen remaining premises, including nightclubs, and ease the restrictions on large events and performances that apply in Step 3. This will be subject to the results of a scientific Events Research Programme to test the outcome of certain pilot events through the spring and summer, where we will trial the use of testing and other techniques to cut the risk of infection. The same Events Research Programme will guide decisions on whether all limits can be removed on weddings and other life events."

It is probably fair to say that we just don't know at this stage. I share your frustration in not knowing, and will of course pass on new information as we receive it. Please keep those people with weddings and baptisms arranged soon after the 21st June in your prayers, as they face some worrying uncertainty right now.

### **Singing In Church**

Again, we just don't know. Currently it isn't permitted inside the building, and it isn't mentioned further in any information we have.
