Churches Count on Nature Week & Climate Sunday

Saturday 5th through to Sunday 13th June

Would you like to help us identify the plants and wildlife that are present in the churchyard at Finningley?

Churches Count on Nature is a nationwide project, run by Caring for God's Acre and the Church of

England in partnership with A Rocha UK, to record nature in churchyards and burial grounds over one week in June.

The charity Caring for God's Acre is using the week to encourage churches to manage their grounds for wildlife, to look for the wildlife present and record any species they fine. The results will be combined and collated on the National Biodiversity Network, a nationwide database of wildlife in the UK.

We are holding an event, on Saturday 5th June between 2.30pm and **4.30pm**, inviting members of our congregation to join with members of Doncaster's Natural History Society, to identify plant and wildlife species in the churchyard that day and record all the wildlife present.
