What A Difference A Drought Makes

In 4 days, despite the threat of rain, 5 of us cleared the herbage from the summer meadow and adjacent areas, including the grass behind the church, in the new churchyard. We even managed to tidy up the overgrown kerbed graves in the western end. The area still needs mowing, and there are other finishing tasks, but they're for another day.

We left some long grass areas as refuges for wildlife. Some 7spot Ladybirds have settled in for winter in the seedheads of Knapweed and Yellow Rattle.

While working, we spotted several butterflies, mostly white, but also Small Coppers and Brown Argus in one area of seeding Common Knapweed. We left this uncut in case they'd laid their eggs there.

In the western end, we found plant bugs, Dock Shieldbugs, a pair of attractively coloured Banded Snails, and various spiders, including a fast-moving spider with long legs and a tiny round black body and a yellow one that stood out against the stone.

Thanks to our volunteers, the churchyard autumn 'cut' was completed before the rain arrived. But most importantly, thanks to God for answered prayer and making it all come together smoothly.

This week marks the beginning of **Creationtide**, a time dedicated to God as the Creator and Sustainer of all life. Our work in the churchyard last week prepared it for winter rest, ensuring its rebirth next year to support God's creatures. While berries, seeds, and nuts sustain life, nature offers much more.

As autumn arrives, take time to immerse yourself in nature. If you can't go outside, sit by a window and observe the greenery. Nature's healing power lies in relaxation and observation.

If you're gardening this autumn, prioritise sustainability for all God's creatures. Take your time and enjoy the process. You may discover hidden treasures.
